Your Church, Your Gift

As Christians and members of a local church, many of us have been giving regularly to the mission and ministry of the parish. But, we are stewards of everything we own, not just our income, and gifts in wills should be a natural part of Christian giving.

Sometimes parish life can feel like an endless cycle of raising money to pay the bills. A gift in your will is different. The PCC should use a Legacy Policy confirming that however large or small, they will use your gift to make a real difference to the life of the parish.





Since the needs change over the years, the PCC encourages gifts to be left for the general purposes of the Parish. PCCs will often discuss with the executors the most appropriate use of your gift in the light of current projects and your areas of interest within the church.
