Christians believe that 40 days after his Resurrection, Jesus went back to be with his Father in Heaven. They call this his Ascension and in 2020 it will be celebrated on May 21st. 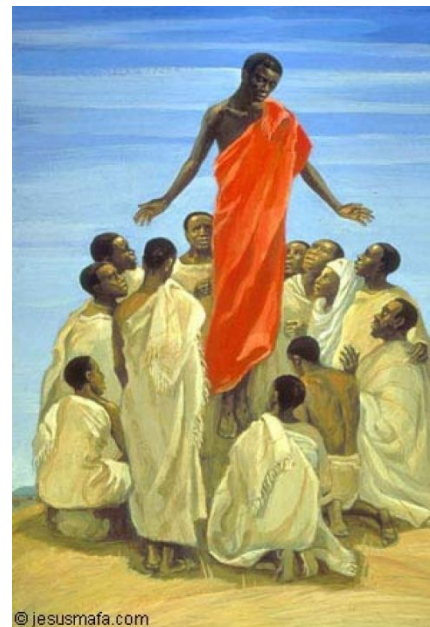
Perhaps you could write a letter to someone who is lonely? Or make them a card? Perhaps you need to try extra hard when your family are being annoying?

The answer will be different for everybody!

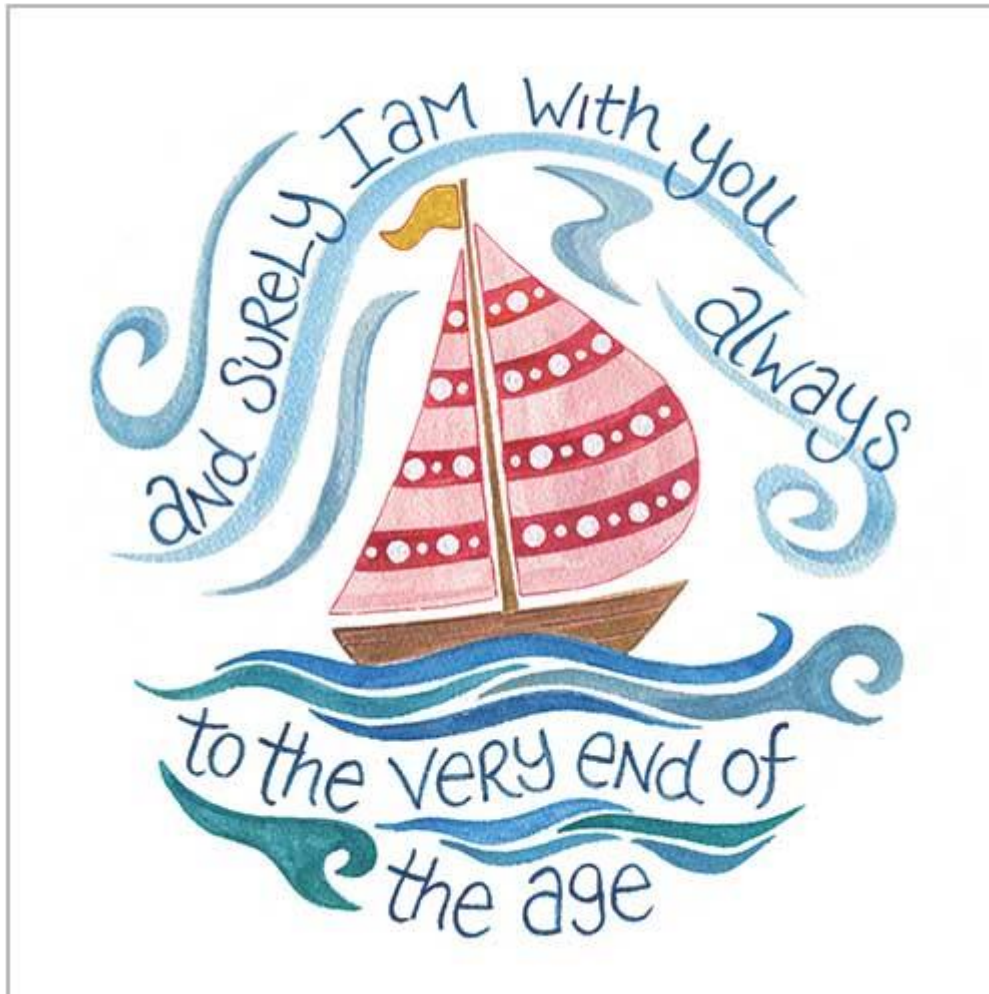
See if you can find out what your local church, or Foodbank or a charity such as [Christian Aid](#) is doing to look after people during Coronavirus.

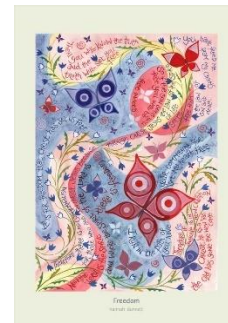
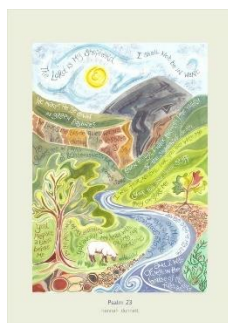


“I am with you”

Jesus Returns to Heaven

After Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples saw him many times and in different places. Jesus taught them more about God. They had no doubt that he was the Jesus they had known before his crucifixion. They knew that he was alive.
