When all those receiving the Bishop's Commission for Mission or the Bishop's Permission to Preach are standing, Bishop Debbie addresses them and says:

Brothers and sisters, do you believe God has called you to this ministry?

I do so believe.

Will you accept the discipline of the Church of England and respect all those who exercise authority with the Bishop of Winchester?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you honour and serve your local church leadership team, and under their authority seek to serve the people of your community?

By the grace of God, I will.

I commission you to this ministry in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

All remain seated while music is played, during which each of the new BCMs and BPPs receive their commission

# THE ADMISSION AND LICENSING OF LAY MINISTERS AND LAY WORKERS

Licenced Lay Ministers and Licensed Lay Workers are called to serve the Church of God and to work together with other ministers in proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ. As authorised ministers they are to lead worship, to preach and teach the word of God, to assist at the Eucharist, to share in pastoral and evangelistic work, and to help the whole Church to participate in God's mission to the world.

The candidates are presented to the Bishop David, saying:

Bishop, I present these persons to be admitted to the office of Licensed Lay Minister or Licensed Lay Worker.

The names of each person to be admitted and the Parish(es) and Deanery in which they will serve, are read

Bishop David addresses the Director of Ministry, who responds accordingly

Are they women and men of Christian character, well versed in the Holy Scriptures and in the doctrines of our faith? *They are.* 

Have they been sufficiently prepared for the duties of this office?

They have.

The Bishop turns to the candidates and says

In order that we may be satisfied that you are ready to begin the ministry of Licensed Lay Minister, or Licensed Lay Worker, you must now answer the questions we put to you.

Do you believe that God is calling you to this ministry? *I do so believe.* 

Will you be faithful in leading the people of God in worship, and in preaching the word to them?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the gospel?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you endeavour to fashion your life according to the way of Christ?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you promote unity, peace and love in the Church and in the world, and especially among those whom you serve? By the grace of God, I will.

Will you work closely with your colleagues in ministry and encourage the gifts of others?

By the grace of God, I will.

The Bishop addresses the clergy of the places in which the candidates will serve as Licensed Lay Ministers or Licensed Lay Workers, who answer accordingly

Will you work closely with your new lay ministers and encourage them to use their gifts and develop their ministry? We will.

Will you commend them to the people among whom they will serve?

We will.

#### THE ADMISSION OF LICENSED LAY MINISTERS

The Bishop admits each one to the office of Licensed Lay Minister and presents them with a Bible and an LLM badge

N, I admit you as a Licensed Lay Minister in the Church, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.* 

The new Licensed Lay Ministers are vested with a blue scarf

# THE ADMISSION OF LICENSED LAY WORKERS

The Bishop admits the candidate to the office of Licensed Lay Worker, presenting them with a Certificate of Admission

*N*, I admit you as a Licensed Lay Worker in the Church, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

# THE PRESENTATION OF LICENSED LAY MINISTERS ARRIVING FROM ANOTHER DIOCESE

The Licensed Lay Ministers transferring from other dioceses move to the front. They are presented to the Bishop with these words

Bishop, I present these Licensed Lay Ministers to be licensed for ministry in this diocese.

The name of each person to be licensed and the Parish(es) and Deanery in which they will serve, is read out

THE LICENSING

The Bishop hands to all the Licensed Lay Ministers their licences and, having done so, addresses them all, saying

Receive this Licence or Permission to exercise the office of Licensed Lay Minister in the Diocese of Winchester.

May the Lord be with you in your ministry.

#### WELCOME TO CHURCH ARMY EVANGELISTS

Church Army Evangelists move to the front to join the Licensed Lay Ministers. They are presented to the Bishop with these words

Bishop, I present these Church Army Evangelists to be welcomed in their new roles in ministry in this diocese

The name of each person is read out. The Bishop says,

May the Lord be with you in your ministry. We welcome you among us as ministers of God's word. May the word of Christ dwell in you richly.

#### REAFFIRMATION OF DEPUTY WARDENS

The Deputy Wardens are invited to stand. The Bishop of Basingstoke, as Warden of Readers, addresses the Deputy Wardens

Will you work with me to pray for and promote lay licensed ministry, and contribute to build up, encourage and provide ongoing training for the community of licensed ministers?

The Deputy Wardens respond

We will.

#### THE WELCOME TO ALL THOSE COMMISSIONED

All those newly licensed and commissioned stand. Bishop David addresses the congregation

#### The Declarations

Before the service the candidates for admission and licensing as Readers make the Declarations in the form prescribed by Canons E 5 and E 6.

The Bishop reads the Preface to the Declaration of Assent

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, The Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

#### The candidates respond:

- I, [Name], do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer I will use only the forms of service which are authorized or allowed by Canon.
- I, [Name], will give due obedience to the Bishop of N and their successors in all things lawful and honest.

Licensed Lay Minister candidates respond:

I, [Name], about to be licensed to exercise the office of LLM in the Diocese [Parish] of N, do hereby promise to endeavour, as far as in me lies, to promote peace and unity, and to conduct myself as becomes a worker for Christ, for the good of his Church, and for the spiritual welfare of all people. I will give due obedience to the minister in whose cure I may serve, in all things lawful and honest.
