

Bishop's Commission for Mission (BCM)

Summer 2024: 3 Programme Streams Available

Three BCM programme streams launch on 20th April 2024. On Tuesday evenings we are offering BCM Pastoral and BCM Children, Families, Youth. On Wednesday evenings we are offering BCM Worship.

- **BCM Pastoral** This programme aims to equip you to be pastoral in different contexts in the church and in the community. It is about developing your skills and exploring your vocation to this ministry. We explore ageing, death, dying and bereavement as well as those tricky conversations around these subjects.
- **BCM Children, Families, Youth.** This is primarily for those who are leading any form of youth or children's ministry in the church. The training will explore faith development in children and provide you with a range of creative ideas for building a strong ministry team.
- **BCM Worship**: This is for those who have a desire to lead God's people into God's presence. The training will cover the core skills required to lead worship in your church/community and on completion carries an authorisation to lead non eucharistic worship more than once a quarter.

What is BCM?

BCM is an opportunity for lay people exploring new areas of ministry or wanting to develop in their existing ministry. Experienced practical trainers lead each session and we also value your existing ministry experience and wisdom. BCM training is therefore both relational and practical. Through participating in the programme you will gain new insights and skills but we also believe God will shape you for your place in his mission.

How does BCM Training Work?

- There is a **Launch Session** where all BCM streams come together and we explore mission spirituality as the backdrop to the topic training to come. This will be held at Wolvesey.
- There are then **6 specialist topic sessions** when we meet together for discussion and tutor input. Mostly these are held online and from 7pm 8.30pm but see individual programme streams for specific details as some sessions are held in person.
- Finally there is a **Closing Morning** to enable you to consider how God has been shaping your for his service. Venue Wolvesey.

What else so I need to know?

- You will need to be recommended by your incumbent and PCC, who should pay your training costs, currently £60 per person.
- BCM highly values relational learning so <u>we ask you to commit to attending all the</u> <u>sessions</u> and to engage with other participants and the online material offered.
- For each of the sessions there is some pre-work material to do online at your own pace and in your own time. We expect this to take up to an hour. This is a key aspect of BCM and we expect everyone to do this. Pre-work materials may consist of something to read, a film to watch, commenting in a forum or engaging in practical actions to explore offline.
- Once you have completed the programme you will need to complete a role description, safeguarding training and may also need a DBS check in order to receive your commission. More information will be provided during the training.
- On successful completion of the programme requirements, you will be commissioned by the Bishop for a BCM role within your benefice as agreed between you and your incumbent
