Programme Outline

Welcome to the journey of the BCM Worship stream, designed for those who feel called to lead God's people into His presence. This program equips individuals with the essential skills required to lead worship in their church or community. Upon completion, participants receive authorization to lead non-eucharistic worship more than once a quarter, making a meaningful impact on congregational worship experiences.

Session 1: Understanding Worship

We identify the qualities and characteristics of a worship leader, grounding our understanding in biblical principles. Sessions 2 & 3: Planning and Leading Worship

Continuing our journey, we explore the intricate process of planning and leading worship in an Anglican setting. We deepen our understanding of Anglican worship traditions while exploring effective methods of crafting worship experiences. Discussions centre around principles for planning worship, recognizing the Holy Spirit's work in Christian worship and harnessing the power of music and singing to enhance worship experiences.

Session 4: Preparing a Short Message

In this session we hone our skills in delivering impactful messages during worship services. Participants learn how to prepare concise and compelling messages that resonate with congregants, fostering spiritual growth and reflection.

Session 5: Leading Intergenerational Worship

We delve into the dynamic realm of intergenerational ministry, exploring its significance and practical implications. Through sharing experiences and insights, we uncover how intergenerational ministry can enrich worship experiences and strengthen the fabric of our faith communities. Participants articulate leadership structures conducive to promoting intergenerational thinking and growth.

Session 6: The Practicalities of Leading Worship

Concluding our journey, participants put their learning into practice by leading a mini worship service in a supportive environment. This hands-on experience allows for growth, encouragement and constructive feedback, empowering participants to become confident and effective worship leaders.
