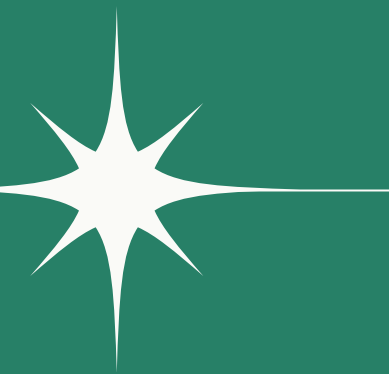

# A WORSHIPPING AND PRAYING CHURCH

In the past few years, the St Leonard's team has refreshed our worship to offer variety and make services accessible for newcomers. Each month we offer:



Café Church, held monthly, alternately in St Leonard's Church and Sherfield Park Community Centre, begins with breakfast and includes worship songs led by our Music Group, drama, discussion and interactive prayers. There is also a joyous informal monthly contemporary Family Service with a mixture of modern and traditional music.



Twice a month our growing group of children meet in the church room as Kids Church to share Bible teaching, craft, and games.

We have two Holy Communion services a month with hymns on the organ.

There is also a quarterly opportunity for the whole Benefice to worship together.

Prayer is at the heart of our worship, and our team of intercessors use a variety of prayer styles including Celtic and Lectio Divina.





# A CARING CHURCH

St Leonard's has a much-used prayer chain, In-touch groups (our lovely pastoral support network) and caring homegroups. We are enthusiastic about ensuring the wellbeing of the vulnerable, home visits, taking worship into our local care homes, starting Lenny's our dementia cafe and supporting our community.

Creation care is especially important at our church, we have been proudly awarded Bronze Eco Church status, continue to encourage biodiversity and currently have active beehives in our churchyard.

Our new Kids Church is growing and opening new opportunities for Forest Church and creative God centred activities. Our aspirational goal continues to be committed to growing a strong spiritual community of Christ.

A church has existed in Sherfield on Loddon for over 900 years, but in the last 2-3 years we have been on a prayer led journey to discover what we will be next.

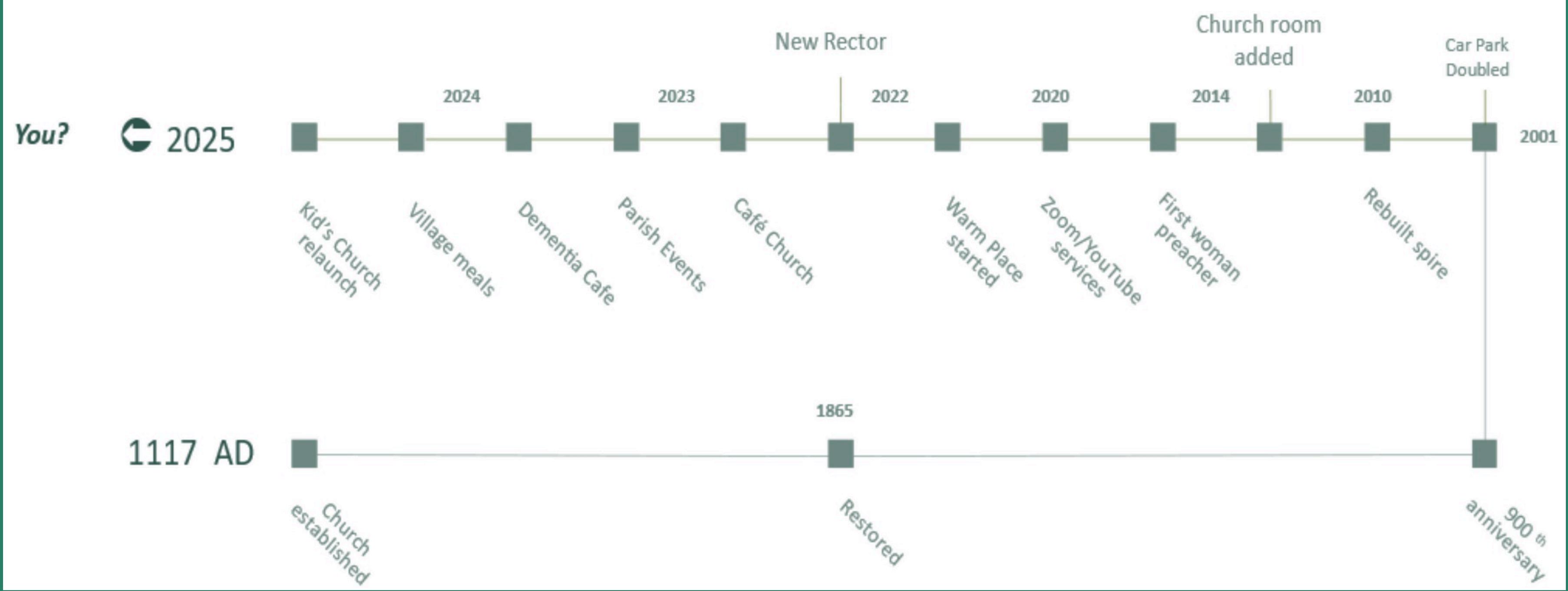

# OUR JOURNEY AT ST LEONARD'S







Sherfield on Loddon is a thriving and welcoming community that was proudly awarded 'Village of the Year 2023' by the Hampshire Association of Local Councils.

The Parish has a population of around 5,000 centred on the Green, the Shop, Coffee Shop and Post Office and the village pubs and the new residential developments at Sherfield Park and Longfield Place just to the south along the A33.

Sherfield on Loddon has the largest Village Fete in Hampshire, drawing in around 4,000 visitors each June. This popular event raises c £10,000 annually for local charities, a great example of the village's generosity and spirit.

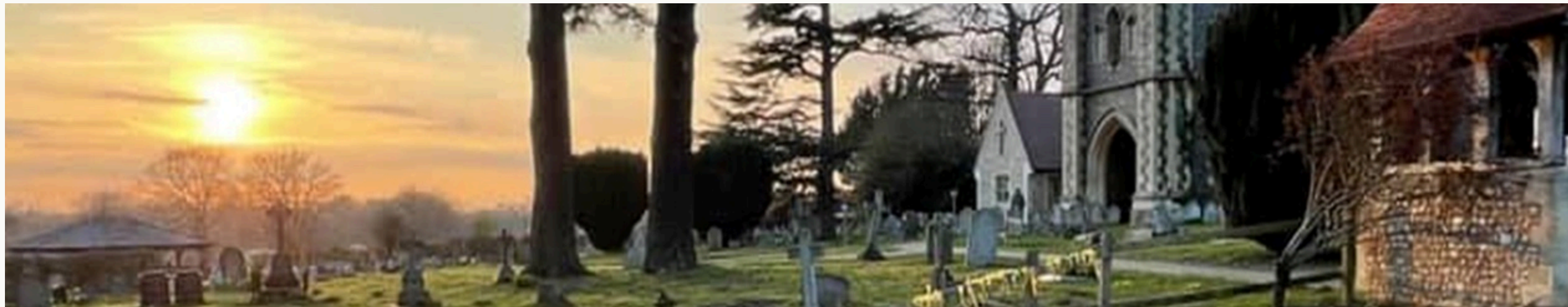
The Village Hall is at the heart of community life, hosting a range of activities from the Happy Faces Play Group, Pilates, Carpet Bowls, St Leonard's Supper Club and the Annual Flower and Produce Show.

# PARISH LIFE

Sherfield Park has a modern and busy Community Centre with a wide range of classes and activities for young mothers, Zumba, Cafe Church, Football, for all ages and more.

The Loddon Valley Link, the village's Church and Community Magazine, is written by local residents and supported by local advertisers. It's distributed free of charge to every household, keeping everyone informed and connected.

Located between the village centre and the new developments to the south, St Leonard's Church plays a vital role in the life of the entire community. Its members are always at the heart of Parish activities, volunteering and supporting local initiatives helping to foster a spirit of community that extends far beyond the church walls.





# LIFE IN OUR BENEFICE – 4 WORSHIPPING COMMUNITIES

We are a Benefice of 5 parishes, 4 church buildings and 3 PCCs. The four churches all have their individual characteristics and personalities and in the last year or so we have been growing closer together and working out how to help one another become the churches God is forming us to be. We are half way through our involvement in the Diocese of Winchester's three year 'Growing Rural Parishes Project' which gives us access to training days, consultancy on children's ministry and £30,000, which we are mainly spending on employing a Benefice Administrator.

# LIFE IN OUR BENEFICE – ST. JAMES BRAMLEY

With two weekly Sunday morning services, we have about 70 adults and 10 children attend either our contemporary ‘Sunday@9’ service (with its growing children’s ministry) or the 10.30 service, which alternates between BCP Matins, Common Worship Communion and Morning Worship. This year we are updating our AV system in the church to expand our offer.

We hold social events and children’s events throughout the year in our hall, where the kitchen has just been refurbished.

There is an active flower team which decorate the church regularly and hold flower festivals. The active bell ringing group attracts new members, and we produce the high quality Bramley Magazine, delivered to every home in the parish.





# ST. MARY'S HARTLEY WESPALL & ST. MARY'S STRATFIELD SAYE



Over the past 3 years we have seen more young families and children join the church when we launched our monthly family service. There is a committed congregation of about 20 adults and 10 children. We also have a monthly BCP service and celebrate seasonal festivals in the church. We have strong links with the community and look for new ways to use the church building, which is the only community space in the village.



Our monthly family service meets 10 times a year and we also join together for seasonal festivals. Our congregation is very small but we are meeting to work out new ways to connect with, serve and invite the people of the village to church and community events, either at the church or the village hall.

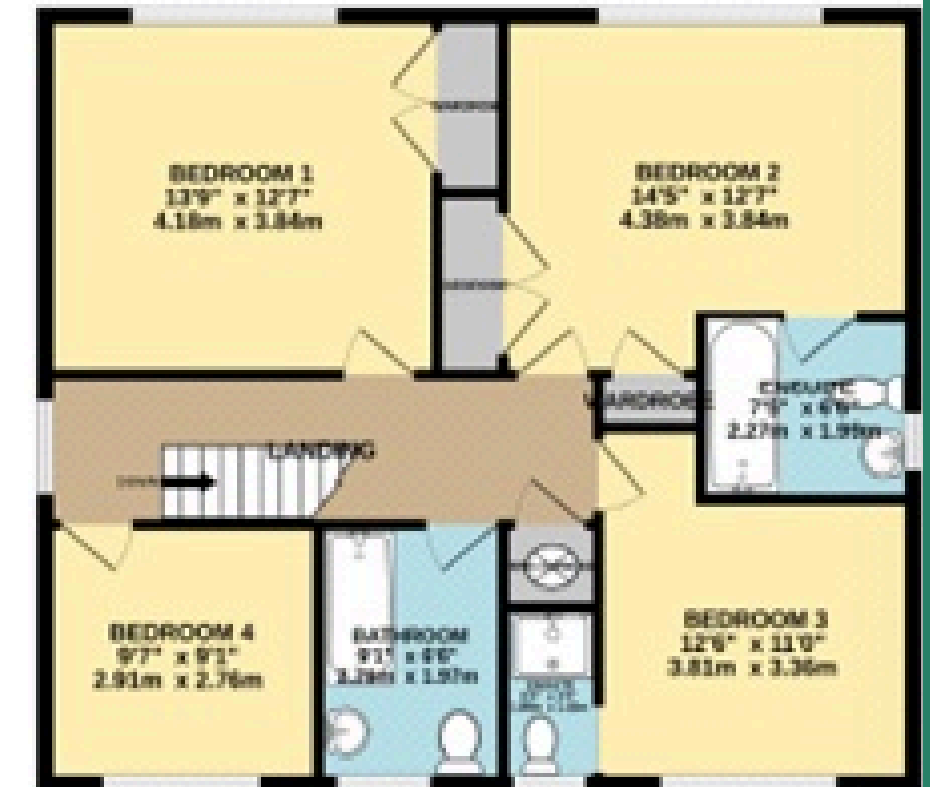

# ODIHAM DEANERY

St Leonard's Church is part of the Diocese of Winchester, which spans Hampshire and parts of Dorset. Led by Bishop Philip Mounstephen, alongside the Bishops of Basingstoke and Southampton, the Diocese is a dynamic and supportive community. The Diocesan Office is home to a dedicated team who offer guidance and encouragement to clergy across the region. Passionate about sharing the love and life of Jesus Christ, the Diocese seeks to transform lives through churches, schools, and chaplaincies.

Within the Odiham Deanery, St Leonard's belongs to a network of 6 Benefices, 19 Parishes, and 28 churches. The Deanery Chapter is very supportive and offers fellowship, prayer, and practical support, keeping clergy connected to local and diocesan initiatives. The Deanery Synod is another great opportunity for you to be part of a lively community, sharing in the mission of Jesus in this wonderful area.







## Bramley

Bramley is a village of about 6,000 people, which has seen lots of new housing built with more to come. It has a station with trains to Reading and Basingstoke, a Church of England primary school, a shop with a Post Office, a GP surgery with a dispensary and a friendly car mechanic.

There's an excellent bakery, the Bramley Inn pub and a village hall.

The surrounding area is great for walking, with plenty of paths and bridleways. The Frith woods, Calleva Roman ruins, The Vyne (National Trust) and Pamber Forest are all close to the village.

Clift Meadow hosts community and youth facilities and hosts the Bramley Fete: a collaboration between Clift Meadow and St James church, with around 2,000 people coming for the stalls, music, displays and dog show.

There are two nursing homes in the parish with monthly church services for residents.

Little London, a village of a few hundred people, is 2 miles north-west of Bramley and is part of the parish. It has a homely and much-loved pub, The Plough.





## Hartley Wespall

We are a village of about 250 residents with a Grade 1 listed church building which has wide range of history dating back to the 14th century. As the only public building in the village, the church has a great opportunity to be the focal point for community activities such as Parish Council and 'Friends' meetings. St Mary's is well supported by many local residents who care deeply for their church, even though they may not attend often. They contribute by cleaning, flower arranging, and maintaining the church and grounds. This was demonstrated recently when nearly £70,000 was raised through donations and grants for the restoration of internal walls and the organ.

## Stratfield Saye

Stratfield Saye is a charming village in the north of the Benefice, home to about 280 people, centred around a residential street with a village hall, with three other hamlets. Stratfield Saye House, home of the Duke of Wellington is in the parish and the Wellington Estate is a major employer and landlord, owning the Farm Shop, Country Park and pubs. The Duke is a generous supporter of repairs to the church, of which he is Patron. St Mary's is grade 1 listed, dating from 1758 and is situated in Stratfield Saye Park, with historic connections to the Dukes and previous owners of the Estate.



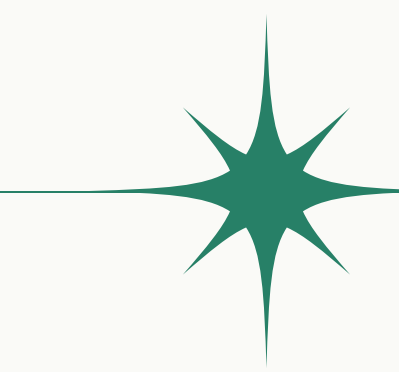


### **Bramley Church of England Primary School**

Most of the young children in our benefice attend Bramley School. It has a very strong Christian ethos which pervades all aspects of school life, underpinned by core Christian values. There is a strong, established link between the school and St James Church, with clergy leading collective worship, staff training, RE lessons, RE visits to the church, taking an active role as a governor and hosting school services at the church throughout the year. The school has a weekly 'Open the Book' assembly, run by Christians from the local church communities. The school has about 450 children and has recently had a very successful SIAMS inspection.

### **Sherfield School**

This is private school for children from nursery to sixth form, with some boarding there. It is located nearly opposite St Leonard's and in the past few years there has been a growing relationship between church and school with children visiting the church and school concerts held in the church; clergy taking RE lessons and speaking at school harvest and Christmas events.



### **The Loddon School**

This a residential school located close to the church and is home for children aged 8 to 19 with profound autism, who are non-verbal and have severe learning difficulties. Our previous Associate Minister visited the school monthly to spend time with staff and did a sky dive to raise money for the school.

### **Wellesley Prep School**

Owned by and located in the Wellington Estate, it has 300 children from 2 to 13 years old. We currently don't go into the school but hope to do so in the future.
