Net Zero Carbon Funding

As well as being good stewards of our finances, God calls us to steward and care for creation. There are several grants available to help with this. One example is the Quick Wins grant. This is for small (up to £3k) carbon reduction projects, such as LED lighting, pew heaters, insulation or updating electricity supplies. Further grants are available for support with making your building more efficient and creating a plan for Net Zero Carbon, with more funding expected from 2026.

The Diocesan Advisory Committee for the Care of Churches (DAC)

The Committee's role is to give the Chancellor of the Diocese its opinion on the suitability of works being proposed by a parish. As part of their deliberations, the Committee will consider; the missional benefit of the proposal, its potential impact on the building's historic fabric, and of course the quality of any design being put to them. Works being proposed could be to a church or in the churchyard. They might include repairs, restoration, conservation, re-ordering – or even building something new.
