In this second video Rowan Williams and Paula Gooder discuss Reason:



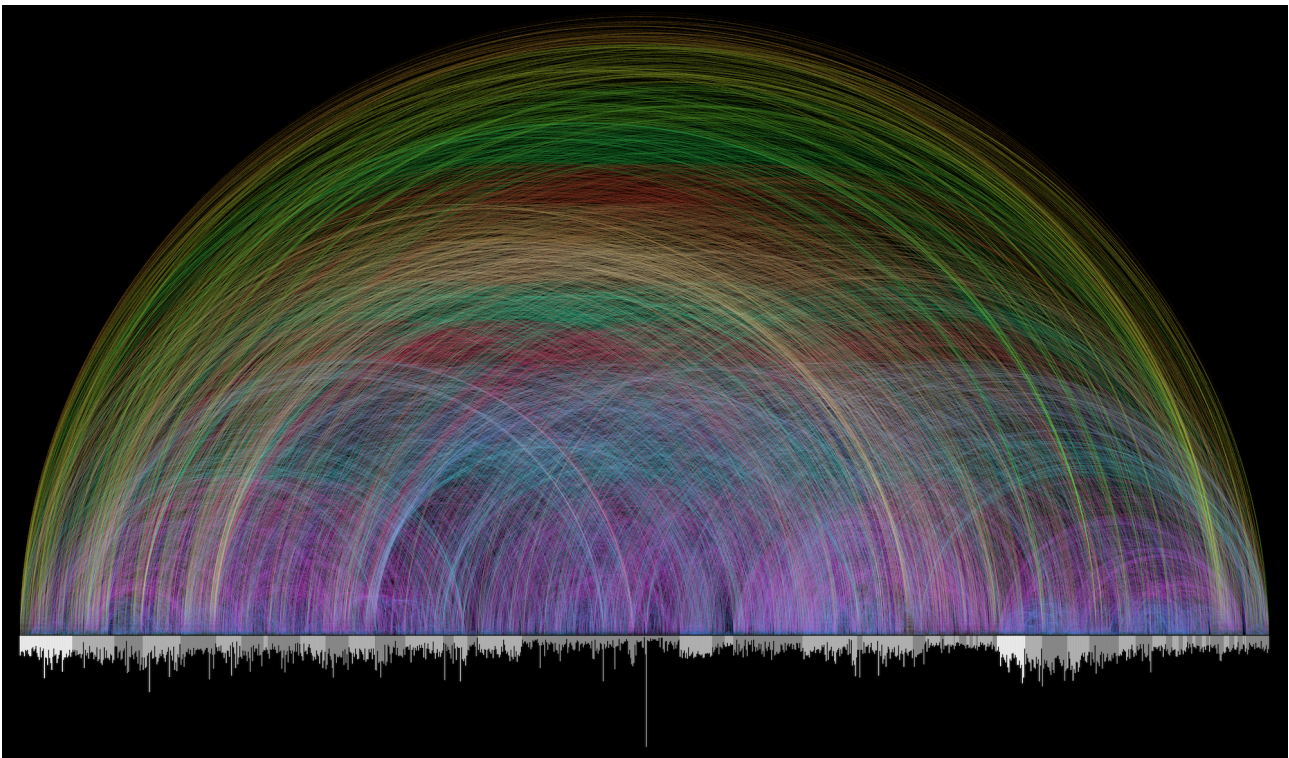
Thirdly, here's a video where the focus is more on reading the Scriptures as having an overarching narrative. It's produced by the Bible Project.

Some more things to watch:

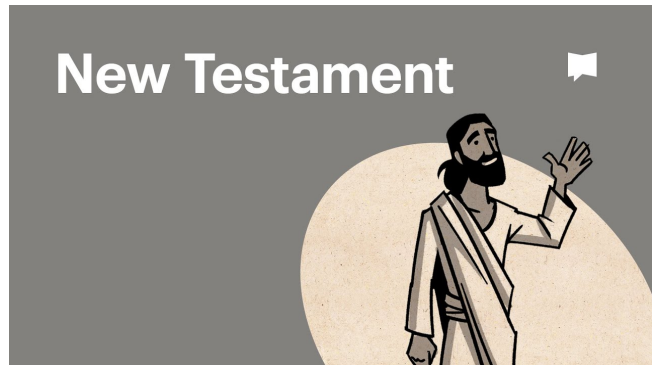
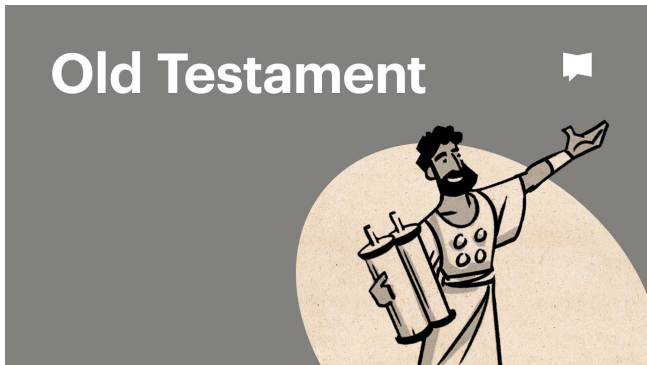
In the following video, Alister McGrath discusses the role of revelation.
