- 5. To encourage, equip and train up leaders both lay and ordained for the growth of the church.
- 6. To establish and promote discipleship within the congregations, enabling deeper personal and corporate growth.
- 7. To develop new and existing relationships and ministry with St Mark's CofE primary school within the benefice, ensuring governance representation where applicable.
- 8. To work collaboratively with other parishes in the deanery and wider community of the church within the area.
