- ❖ Will strengthen focus on discipleship among families, young adults, and children, helping to nurture faith across all ages.
- Will build on strong links with the three Church Schools and other local organisations that involve children and young people.
- ❖ Is able to develop a network to deliver excellent pastoral care.
- ❖ Will encourage and release financial generosity to enable the Benefice's vision.
- Will fully participate in and contribute to the life of the deanery (including synod and chapter) and diocese.
