We are excited by the opportunities before us and warmly invite applications from those who want to join us in addressing them.



Belong

We have spent the last eighteen months building relationships throughout the local community including statutory and local organisations. This has meant going out of the buildings to meet people but also working out ways to invite the community into our churches and halls. This has caused us to rethink how we are the body of Christ serving this community. We have started activities which serve God by creating safe spaces in our buildings. In order to continue to develop and grow further, our premises require repair and refurbishment.

Believe

We believe that the worshipping community should be Inclusive and Intergenerational. We believe that God is calling us to faith-filled growth as we are seeing increasing interest in our community activities and in the enquiries for occasional offices. As a result of recent community outreach, we have completed a Start! Discipleship group and are sharing this material with the entire congregation and community in September 2025. We will continue to develop discipleship through our activities, church services and prayer group.

Become

We believe that with the increase in interest from the community through the activities and by providing a discipleship programme God will provide us with resources we need to repair and refurbish our current gathering spaces. The vision includes growing an additional worshipping community to the north of the benefice as well as developing the links at the southern end. The aim of all this work is to grow the community of disciples across Maybush benefice.

St Peter's Church is the Parish church, built in 1958. There is a church hall which is available for letting.
Sunday service is a weekly Eucharist.
The style is traditional. Although regarded as a service for 'older people' over the last 12 months several young families have joined and attend

Weekly attendance is approximately 15-20 adults and 3-7 children.

The majority of occasional offices take place here and the many of the community view it as their family church.

This congregation has a strong link with the neighbouring assisted living complex (Potters Court) which we visit monthly. Civic services take place here as well as school Harvest assemblies, Christingle and carol services.

From September 2025 we also host the weekly rehearsal for Nursling and Rownham's Community Wind Band.



St Peter's Church Hall is currently not used by the church but is a source of income with long term lets. The hall building needs some refurbishment and as part of our long-term vision we are considering options regarding its future use.





The Church was built in 1964. The adjoining church hall was built in 2005. Sunday service is a weekly gathering mainly for primary age school children (7 adults and 3-7 children).

The All Saints' site hosts the parish office, hall and rooms for letting. The hall is hired out regularly to the community for parties. There are long-term rentals for community partnerships and charities. A weekly community pantry is hosted on this site (SCM Millbrook





We are currently fundraising to replace the leaking roof and refurbish All Saints' church. We plan to develop the site as All Saints Church and Community Centre.



Southampton Deanery

Recent news:

Southampton Deanery is currently in the process of submitting a bid for a substantial project across the deanery, called 'Believing in Southampton'. This will involve all our parishes working much more closely together (with extra resource) and will be an exciting opportunity for Maybush congregation members to contribute to and benefit from some wider city-wide missional momentum.



Background information:

Southampton is an exciting and growing city and the Deanery of 19 parishes looks forward to welcoming you into our Chapter and Synod. The city itself is growing in population and in diversity. There are many new developments of housing as well as commercial and cultural spaces adding to an already rich offer of theatres, concert halls, parks, and museums. Major employers in the city include the two universities, a large regional teaching hospital (within Maybush Benefice) as well as the passenger and cargo ports which keep Southampton Water busy with some of the largest ships in the world. Our city also has its challenges, and some of our parishes are amongst the most deprived in the Diocese and in the country. Churches in our Deanery are committed to sharing the love of God in practical action in mission to the people we serve.


