- Has a keen, loving interest in people and is able to engage with members of the community (whether church-goers or not) of all ages and at varying stages of faith, seeking to bring the Gospel's good news to everyone.
- Continues the parish's established approach to services that includes both traditional and informal forms of worship and honours the strengths of both, while evolving and improving them based on his or her own experience and expertise.
- Values musical contributions to services.
- Ensures the provision of good pastoral care across the parish.
- Encourages and builds a stronger team and collaborative effort in all the parish does, working closely with authorised ministers and volunteers.
- Identifies and trains further lay people to take on roles in church and community life, recognising and nurturing their talents in the process while deepening their spirituality.
- ❖ Is committed to work creatively together with other clergy and laity in the Deanery to formulate new strategies for the future; most especially potentially involving closer collaboration with Arle Valley benefices and other parts of the Deanery.
