- ♦ Will strengthen our focus on discipleship among families, young adults, and children, helping us to nurture faith across all ages.
- ♦ Will build on our strong links with the Infant and Junior Schools and other local organisations that involve young people.
- ◆ Will inspire the church to be a relevant Christian presence in the community; especially in serving the disadvantaged and marginalised.
- ◆ Will make time to comfort those in need, those who are ill and those whose life on earth is ending, together with the existing pastoral support team.
- ♦ Will provide supportive leadership to all in positions of parish responsibility, enabling them to carry out their roles confidently and effectively in partnership with the incumbent.
