Affordable Learning

The course programme includes both onsite and online courses, as noted. Most day courses are onsite and cost £70 for the standard rate. A day course with ensuite B&B at the educational rate is £145.

Our online courses are either half-days, usually costing £40, or evenings, which cost £20. Look out for our special deals on online courses that run across a series of sessions.

Sarum Course in Spiritual Direction

This programme aims to equip those who are called to the ministry of Spiritual Direction to confidently and competently accompany others.

The course is delivered in several formats: residential, online, and mixed mode, to accommodate access requirements and learning preferences.

The next three cohorts begin in January 2026 (mixed mode), April 2026 (online), and September 2027 (residential). All courses include taught sessions with expert tutors, small group work, practice in Spiritual Direction, reflective activities and feedback. For application details please see the website.

Postgraduate Programmes in Christian Spirituality


Both rigorously academic and applicable to students' personal faith life and journey, Sarum College offers field-leading postgraduate study in Christian Spirituality.

Our students come from a wide range of academic and professional backgrounds, which fosters excellent discussion. There is no requirement to have formally studied theology prior to the course. Our flexible approach offers the benefits of in-person teaching and is designed to fit around busy lives.

Students learn in modules taught by world-leading experts. Modules are arranged around four-day teaching intensives in person at Sarum College in the beautiful Cathedral Close in Salisbury. These in-person modules are supplemented by seminars and tutorials online.

The study of the history and development of Christian spiritual and mystical texts, movements and figures; 2


Questioning how Christian spirituality engages with and speaks into a range of contemporary issues such as embodied spirituality or gender and sexuality; 3
